1. Forewords of the Chairman of the Board of Directors

In 2015 The Foundation for Holocaust Victims (FHV) celebrated its 15th anniversary. Fifteen years of its existence have demonstrated that a decision in 2000 to establish the FHV, was appropriate. In collaboration between the state representatives and the representatives of the Jewish communities we are managing to provide an effective support to Shoa victims, remind of the Nazi crime and the causes that lead to that crime. We are providing a long-term support to the restoration of Jewish monuments – synagogues, cemeteries and other monuments or pieces of property – that would, after the killing of the majority of Jewish population, deteriorate if not getting a financial support and professional care. It is not only a matter of finance, we also have to thank to all volunteers and people who are getting a symbolic pay for their effort to save and maintain these monuments or property. FHV, at the same time, supports the development of Jewish communities and education in judaism. Even though there is no chance to heal the wound that Jewish people suffered from Nazism, the

mission of the FHV is to, at least, mitigate the consequences of the atrocities.

Apart from a financial support of other subjects, the FHV generates its own activities, which comply with its mission stated at the time of FHV establishment. We contribute to the public events connected with the remembrance of Shoa victims, we organise a beneficial concert, we organise seminars and discussion cafes.

The existence of the FHV is an example of a good autonomous existence. The financial means, that mostly originate from the state budget, are effectively managed and professionally distributed. As a result of FHV's effort, in 2015, following the earlier decision of the Ministry of Finance of the Czech Republic, the FHV signed an agreement with the Czech Ministry of Culture on a five-year financing period in which an amount of CZK 20 million will be transferred to FHV's account every year. Thanks to these financial means, the FHV can continue with its work in the following years as well. In 2015, the FHV

supported 111 projects out of which 96 have been supported by the Ministry of Culture endowment benefit. We still have to thank to all other donors and contributors for their support. No matter how big the donation, the FHV will always find the right use of it.

The activity of FHV is reviewed by an independent auditor on yearly basis. There is a special and individual review of the state endowment benefit, too. These reviews assure us that the FHV uses the entrusted financial means properly.

Finally, I would like to thank to the whole FHV team for their professional work which constitutes a base for FHV's success. I also would like to thank to all of my colleagues from the Board of Directors and Supervisory Board as well as all of the experts that support us in grant committees. Special thanks to Michal Borges for his long-term leadership of the Board of Directors which he chaired till last year.

The FHV was established on July 31, 2000 on the basis of the recommendations of the “Joint Working Committee Focusing on Mitigating Some Property Injustices to Holocaust Victims”. On September 15, 2000, based on the governmental proposal, the Chamber of Deputies of the Czech Parliament made a decision to transfer funds, amounting CZK 300 million, over to the Foundation for Holocaust Victims.

In the years 2001–2005 we administered the Compensation programme, in which we distributed CZK 100 million among those, whose property in today’s Czech Republic had been confiscated during WWII on the basis of racial laws and who were unable to retrieve it or receive compensation through the then applicable restitution laws or international agreements. The programme has been closed for several years now and our Foundation is currently not dealing with claims of this kind in any way.

On December 18, 2014, the FHV signed an agreement with the Czech Ministry of Culture on a five-year financing period in which an endowment benefit amounting CZK 20 million will be transferred to FHV’s account on yearly basis.

3. Grant Programmes

Care, Remembrance, Renovation, Future and Our Future

As of 2015, based on the terms and conditions of the Ministry of Culture endowment benefit, our terms and conditions for our programmes Remembrance, Renovation and Future (including the sub-programme Our Future) have been adapted.

The call for proposals is announced once a year, usually in July, and the deadline for projects is September. The projects are realised during the following year.

FHV supports projects prepared especially by organisations under the umbrella of the Federation of Jewish Communities, NGOs, public beneficial organisations, institutions established by the church, public service institutions, and allowance organisations registered within the Czech Republic. All organisations must be registered in the Czech Republic. Physical persons are not entitled to ask for benefits.

We only support projects that are realised within the territory of the Czech Republic.

The endowment benefits are granted for a period of 11 months, and in case of Care programme the period is one calendar year.

We favour projects having various financing sources.

In Care and Renovation Programmes, there is no limit for a maximum requested amount. The maximum amount of the endowment benefit within the Future and Our Future programmes is CZK 100,000.

The applications must be submitted on relevant forms available on the FHV website.

The applications are evaluated by the respective grant committees nominated by the FHV Board of Directors. The Board of Directors grants endowment benefits on the basis of their recommendation.

To obtain the foundation's endowment benefit there is no legal claim. The results of grant call are published on the FHV website and all applicants are informed in writing. We sign contracts with all of our successful applicants. Afterwards we follow and review the use of the monetary

means during the realisation of the project. In case of any violation of contractual conditions, we demand the return of the granted money. The supported organisations present the FHV with progress and final reports on the projects, as well as reports on the budget. All projects financed by the Ministry of Culture financial means are audited.

We actively participate in supported projects and in case the beneficiary asks for any assistance, we provide them with our support.

In 2015 we supported in total 111 projects majority of which were co-financed by the Ministry of Culture.

On December 7, 2015, the FHV Board of Directors selected 114 projects that will receive a support in 2016 amounting a total of CZK 22 million.

4. Care Programme

Each year we are supporting the projects of organisations that provide professional social care, healthcare and psychological care to Holocaust survivors. The care for survivors is our priority. We strive to support them in their quality life and provide them with the best available care in their old age. We financially support homeware, nursing services, psychological aid, residential care, day care centres run by Jewish communities, social workers, social advisory services, personal assistants, medical care, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, rehabilitation, phone contact services and many other activation programmes. We shall not forget about the survivor's second generation. In relation to Claims Conference projects, we cooperate with a project coordinator Dita Snajdrova from Czech office.

5. Remembrance Programme

We focus our attention to the education of young people through supporting activities having an expert leadership with an involvement of Shoa witnesses. We also contribute to various commemoration events and pious acts, exhibitions, workshops, researches or book publications.

6. Renovation Programme

We support renovation and maintenance of immovable and movable Jewish property and monuments throughout the Czech Republic. Our goal is to restore the monument to its original state when the monument was built or, if this is not feasible, we then restore the monument to the state that would capture the maximum of the architectonic, artistic and artisanal elements.

We renovate synagogues, rabbi homes and Jewish cemeteries. Our special focus is on restoration of precious tombstones. Our financial means do not enable us to restore all tombstones, so we also support cemetery documentation in order to have a digital image of its look saved for future generations.

All projects must be lead by professionals.

Overview of 2015 Granted Endowment Benefits

In 2015, we supported 33 projects with a total amount of CZK 15,750,000. Following the auditor's review of the Ministry of Culture endowment benefit we financed 32 projects by a total amount of CZK 15,628,135. With a use of our own resources, we supported an investment project of Prague Jewish Community – Restoration of Caretaker's House of Jewish Cemetery in Beroun – 3rd Stage – CZK 50,000.

9. Projects of Our Own

Alongside to our grant activities, we devote our attention to organising educational programmes. The programmes are prepared for our partner organisations, sometimes we prepare the programmes jointly. We are staying in touch, we map the needs of their employees and conduct an active search for ways how to help Jewish organisations with their work and activities. We are also well aware of the importance of the communal aspect of our work. Therefore, we organize cultural events and seminars that help to cultivate communal life in Jewish communities and we help other organizations to launch projects that enrich their social life.



We Educate

Educational seminars for employees of Jewish and partner organisations



In 2015 we organised a seminar called “Jewish Holidays”. Part of the seminar were lectures on: Holiday Time and Everyday Routine in Jewish Tradition, Jewish Calendar (rabbi Stepan Kliment), Main Holidays and Pilgrim Holidays (Elise Peter Apelbaum), Tu BiShvat, Purim, Chanukkah and Their Community Importance (Tereza Vanova), and Modern Israeli Holidays (Daniel Ziss). We have been running the seminars for partner organisations since 2009. We have had traditional supporters (partners) of the seminars, namely Prague Jewish Community and Federation of Jewish Communities in the Czech Republic.

Mechanchim – Seminar for teachers and lecturers of Jewish educational institutions



The Mechanchim Seminar has become our priority project. In 2015, the seminar was organised for the third time in a row. The seminar was attended by 30 teachers and lecturers of Czech and Slovak Jewish communities, schools, kindergartens and other educational organisations. The lectures were divided into two days – the first was aimed at teachers of kindergarten and school-age children and the second day dealt with topics connected with teen and adult education. Mechanchim seminar lecturers were: Executive Vice-President and CEO of The Ronald S. Lauder Foundation, a director of Berlin Beth-Zion School Judith Zinner and a coordinator of programmes of Budapest Jewish Community Baalint Zsuzsi Fritz.

We are glad to claim that Mechanchim has become an established platform for meeting of Czech Jewish teachers and that it helped to connect particular Jewish organisations as well as it created a professional group of Czech teachers and lecturers. The Mechanchim Seminar was financially supported by L. A. Pincus Fund for Jewish Education in the Diaspora, American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Dutch Jewish Humanitarian Fund, Prague Jewish Community Foundation and Prague Jewish Community.

Seminars for workers in social services

Care for Shoa survivors is our top priority and therefore, since 2011, we have been holding educational seminars for workers in social services, carers, health visitors, psychotherapists and psychologists who work with Jewish clients and their families. These seminars deal with general issues of care, methods, new aspects of social work as well as with specific topics connected to the field of care for Jewish clients. In 2015, we prepared 2 seminars accredited by the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs.



- Palliative care and hospice care in social services. The principles of palliative care, possibilities and limitations in various environments, psycho-social aspects of palliative care, etc. The seminar was attended by 11 participants coming from Czech Jewish communities.
- Introduction to the communication with client with challenging behaviour. The participants learned to recognize and eliminate the triggers of challenging behaviour and acquire the working methodology when dealing with clients with challenging behaviour. The seminar also addressed corresponding legal aspects of social work; the participants were introduced to primary and secondary prevention and de-escalation techniques. The seminar was attended by 12 participants.



We organise discussion cafes



The concept of discussion cafes was fully brought to life in 2015. The cafes are held under the name “I am Jewish and I Prosper”. The project started in 2014. The aim these panel discussions is strengthening of an awareness on the variety of contemporary Czech Jewish community. Altogether we held 4 discussion cafes. We hosted the following pairs of guests: Tomas Pojar and Vladimir Mlynar, Irena Douskova and Tamara Moyzes, Jakub Szantó and Jakub Zelezny and at the end of 2015 Arnost Goldflam and Ester Janeckova. The cafe sessions were all held in “Cafe Jedna” and were prepared and moderated by Irena Kalhousova. The cafes were held with a financial support of American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

We organise a benefit concert

In November 2015, we organised benefit concert that was newly held on the premises of Cafe Jedna in Trade Fair Palace (Veletzni palac) in Prague. At the beginning of the concert there was an address of FHV Board of Directors Chairman, Mr. Michal Klima and HM Ambassador of Israel to CZ, Mr. Gary Koren. The main performing star of the night was Mr. Miroslav Zbirka and his band. The concert was moderated by Ester Janeckova, and again, presented a great opportunity to thank to our donors and partners who have been supporting our activities and meet friends and representatives of partner organisations in a relaxed environment of the Cafe Jedna. The benefit event raised a total of CZK 33,152. The funds will be used for projects in CARE Program supporting organisations caring for Shoa survivors.



We Remember



On the occasion of the 70th anniversary of Auschwitz Birkenau camp liberation we organised a discussion cafe called “70 Years after Auschwitz – What Now?“. The topic of the discussion were current issues and remembering the Shoa in the future. The discussion was

moderated by Jan Fingerland, the guest were Dagmar Lieblova, Fedor Gal and Jan Poloucek.

We helped to organise the conference called “Let My People Live!” organised by European Jewish Congress on January 26 and 27, 2015, in Prague and Terezin.

We Inform

We strive to do our best in informing about our work and the way we provide support as well as about various possible ways of supporting our Fund. We frequently update our website www.fondholocaust.cz and our facebook profile with articles on our own projects or information about events of our partner organisations. We also publish more detailed information, news reports and interviews as part of our quarterly InfoBulletin.

10. Grant of the Ministry of Culture

On December 18, 2014, the FHV signed an agreement with Czech Ministry of Culture on a long term partnership on a project called “Provision of Endowment Benefits in FHV Programmes – Renovation, Remembrance and Future”.

On July 28, 2015, we received the final resolution of the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic on a provision of endowment benefit amounting CZK 20 million from state budget to be used in 2015. The endowment benefit conditions did not fully match the FHV grant rules, therefore there was a need to adjust some of the projects and their budgets. The endowment benefit should not be used as an investment, the funds cannot cover e.g. the costs for accounting services, legal services, training costs or project development costs.

The endowment benefit financed all of our projects in FHV programmes – Remembrance and Future (including the sub-programme Our Future), and with an exception of one project, also the projects in Renovation Programme. Out of the granted CZK 20 million we did not manage to use CZK 132,925. In total, there were 96 projects financed with the Ministry of Culture grant. The funds also covered the FHV administrative costs.

We would like to thank all of the participating subjects for their cooperation. It enabled us to manage the use of the granted funds and implement the needed projects.

11. Financial Report

The FHV financial report was assessed for a period from January 1 to December 31, 2015.

In 2000, the FHV received an endowment that amounted CZK 300 million from the former State Property Fund, today's Ministry of Finance of the Czech Republic. These financial means are distributed in harmony with the stated rules. A large proportion of these financial means has been distributed as part of the endowment benefits, the remaining CZK 56 million is invested in shares. Part of the funds is administered by CSOB Asset Management, second part is managed by Conseq Investment Management, a. s.

On January 29, 2014, the contract on the transfer and use of financial means be-

tween FHV and the Ministry of Finance of the Czech Republic was terminated, all of the unused funds remained in the administration of FHV; the funds will further be administered as FHV own funds.

Thanks to the merger with CCNV on September 1, 2009, the FHV received stock amounting to CZK 3,046 thousands. This stock was deposited to Ceska Sportelna portfolio until its due date on December 31, 2011. In November 2012, these means were transferred to a current account of FHV. These financial means were used as endowment benefits as part of the Care Programme in 2015.

A total amount of granted funds in 2015 was CZK 21,853 thousands. (out of which

CZK 17,374 thousands were granted by the Ministry of Culture as an endowment benefit, CZK 21 thousands was a 2014 benefit concert income, CZK 16 thousands income from a public collection and CZK 5 thousands was donated by Prague Jewish Community).

The FHV administration costs in 2015 amounted to CZK 3,912 thousands. Out of this sum CZK 361 thousands were the FHV own projects organised by FHV (educational seminars, discussion cafe "I am Jewish and I prosper", benefit concert). CZK 40 thousands worth the costs were covered by the FHV's own funds and CZK 321 thousands have been paid from other external sources. CZK 2,493 thousands of the administration costs were covered by the Ministry of Culture endowment benefit.

University in 1984. Till 1989, he worked as a computer programmer. From 1990 to 1997, he was the head of Lidove Noviny publishing. Between 1998-2000 he worked as a Director-General of Economia Publishing. In 2000, he established, and later also managed, for three years, an internet publishing, Economia Online. Between 2003 and 2009 he was a Director-General and the Chairman of Board of Directors of Economia Publishing. From 2007–2009, he also worked as a Chairman of the Board of Directors of Ecopress Publishing. Between 2011 and 2012 he worked as a director of Slovak publishing house “Spolocnost 7 Plus” in Bratislava. In

2013 he founded a tablet weekly called “Dotyk”. From 1992-2011 he was a member of Board of Directors and Vice-President of the World Association of Newspapers seated in Paris.

In 2003, he bought a decaying building of the former synagogue in Hartmanice na Sumave, established a civic association that reconstructed the synagogue, and runs a monument that reminds us of the co-existence of Czechs, Germans and Jews in the Sumava region. He publishes political commentaries and articles mostly focusing on the problems of the media in newspapers and magazines. Occasionally, he gives lectures in the Czech Republic and abroad. He is married with two adult children.



Prof. Ing. Felix Kolmer, DrSc. Honorary Chairman

A graduate of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering of the Czech Technical University in Prague and

the Czech Technical University with a major in Physics and Acoustics. Professor Kolmer is a survivor of the concentration camps in Terezin, Auschwitz and Friedland. From 1949 till 1991, he worked in The Research Institute of Sound, Picture and Speaker Technology in Prague as a scientist, and later on as the Head of the Acoustics Department, Scientific Vice-Director, and Director of the Institute. After his retirement, he worked as an advisor to the Director of the Institute. Since 1962, he has collaborated with the Czech Technical University, later with the Film and TV School of the Academy of Performing Arts as a teacher of Acoustics, and since 1982, with the academic title of Professor. He is the author of many publications and gives lectures all over the world. Lately, he has mostly been giving lectures on Czech-German relations during WWII, and on the life in the concentration camps, to schools and and Christian-Jewish associations in Germany. He holds several state awards and is an honourable member of several scientific

societies in the Czech Republic and abroad. Currently, Professor Kolmer is a Vice-President of the Internationales Auschwitz Komitee, vice-chairman of the Czech Auschwitz Committee, is a member of the Board of the Bundesverband für Information und Beratung der NS-Verfolgten in Cologne, Germany and a member of the Board of the Terezin Initiative, the Board of Directors of the Czech Association for the Victims of Nazism, the Council of the Federation of Jewish Communities in the Czech Republic and a member of the Czech-German Board of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic and Germany.

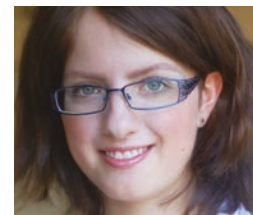
Mgr. Andrea Fictumova – Coordinator of FHV programmes: Care, Remembrance, Future
